MODERN HUNTING & COURTESY

We should continue to put our energies into looking to the future, but there is always tradition, especially with recommended dress for hunting – it's safe, it's practical and it's smart.

When hunting with the Badsworth & Braham Moor: **'Sensible clothes and tack is required. Brightly coloured fashion statements are inappropriate for both horse and rider. Turnout should always be neat, clean and safe – If your hair is of any significant length, for safety and smartness please use a hairnet. The tails of hunt ties (stocks) should be secured.'**

Hunting dress remains very traditional. Occasionally the newspapers have carried ill informed articles about riders who go hunting wearing 'silly clothes', red coats, old fashioned, pretentious outfits and not being in the 21st Century – relics from the past! Just to quote a few thoughts from journalists.

Just for a day, I'd like to go hunting with one of these critics. I'd choose to be traditionally dressed, wearing a good heavy woollen hunt coat, black leather boots and gloves etc. I'd choose a January day, when the sleet is horizontal, the mud is everywhere and the temperature is hovering around freezing. This would be uncomfortable for anyone but, the traditional hunting coat would repel the damp whilst keeping warm, the jodhpurs would not rub my legs even when wet and would dry quickly and my boots would protect my legs and keep my feet dry. I can't imagine what it must be like to follow hounds for 6 hours wearing jeans, trainers and a nylon jacket – but I'm sure it would be cold, wet and dangerous.



Hunting clothes and tack have evolved over hundreds of years and have arrived, via applied common sense and years of Health & Safety in action, to finally be recognisable as the traditional hunting kit we know today. The hunting kit is an attractive, sensible set of clothes which can be very flattering, if worn well; is warm, hardwearing, safe, visible, comfortable and smart. A Hunter's horse should wear good safe, simple, plain tack – the horse should wear the tack not vice versa.

There is some wonderful, entertaining, basic and at times, very personal advice about correct dressing and necessary preparations given in the old hunting books, for example – Under the heading of 'Supply & Maintenance' there is advice given to hunters which covers everything from getting ready, what to wear, what to have for breakfast, how to make the best hunting sandwich (complete with recipes) and how to pack a days rations: what alcoholic beverage to put in the flask (I think I'll pass on raw eggs beaten up in port and carried in a flask of vast dimensions).

Examples of advice for the Field taken from a late 19th Century hunting book – The Hunter will do well to trim his toenails and to don clean, patch-less socks and underclothes on a hunting morning, for who knows if he will take a tumble and be undressed by his bank manager? What will he say when next going for an overdraft if his expensive breeches hid a seat-less pair of undergarments?

In former days it was the habit of 'Men of Society' to use expensive perfumes. Nowadays it is felt that the pack has sufficient to contend with from the fumes of motor exhausts and cigars, however, if not wearing perfume the gentleman hunter is politely requested to take a bath shortly before appearing in the hunting field so as not to confuse hounds.

Here is the Hunter, washed, wearing clean underclothes and socks, he has his sandwiches and should have his watch correctly set, but he is hardly ready to take the field.

Ingredients for appropriate dress for the Season – this is still remains the norm in the 21st Century
To wear with Black hunt coat (black or dark blue for ladies) – Waistcoat: black bowler or black /dark blue velvet Cap: Shirt & white hunting tie (stock): Buff/beige jodhpurs (ladies occasionally wear cream) – white breeches should only be worn with the red coat: black boots + gloves. Ladies with hair of a reasonable length should wear a hairnet for safety and smartness. No distracting jewellery for safety and smartness.

Children / young people wear tweed hacking jackets and buff/beige jodhpurs all year.

That's better: our hunter is now dressed and decent. But before joining the Hunting Field he should check he has a clean handkerchief, his flask, his gloves, his whip, his Field Money for the Secretary, safety pins to preserve modesty if repairs are required to his torn breeches – better a safety pin than be arrested for indiscretion. The hunter should always remember to take along his smile and his good manners – hunting is his joy and his pleasure and as such, it should be shared.

TUMBLERS' CLUB

Season 2010 /2011

The Badsworth & Bramham Moor Tumblers' Club is intended to be a 'tongue in cheek' and entertaining way to raise funds for the Hunt. It's intended to celebrate the brave, the foolhardy, the muddy, the wet, the good the bad and occasionally, the ugly! There have to be a few guidelines to ensure fair play!

Membership should be considered an honour and a privilege by all who have a sense of fun.



Rules of 'The Tumblers' Club'

- This will be an Elite Club. The 'Elite' Membership will be invitation only. Membership will be restricted to the Members of the Field who hit the ground unintentionally and importantly, with the only damage done being a dent to the ego and perhaps with a little mud attached!
- There is only one exception to Membership of the Tumblers' Club – The Field Master of the Day will be exempt – reason: he /she's a hero for a day and the Field Master will perhaps not have the opportunity to have a good look before leaping. However, on days when a MFH (or other) is not acting as Field Master the gloves are off and tumbling will definitely count!
- Membership of the Tumblers' Club will start at the beginning of the Autumn Season – JTW will keep the tally. She will collect your contributions the listings, complete with rider's excuses will go on the Tumbler's Club page of the website to help judging. In the event of a tie, the silliest, best & most unlikely excuse for tumbling will swing the result! The Supporters' Committee will act as judge and jury. The Chairman's decision will be final.
- To preserve privacy, Tumblers can choose how to present themselves - first names only, full names, initials or pseudonym will be used on the website – it's not really a problem – we'll all know who you are!!
- All Tumblers will be invited to join the Tumblers' Club from the date of their tumble. So when / if you receive your invitation, please, join in the fun with a good heart and a smile – who knows you may even win!
- A chart on the web page will be updated after each Meet, listing 'incidents', league standing & income raised.

- Photographs of tumbles are very welcome for the web page (however, in the case of a really, truly embarrassing photograph, a small 'bribe' (aka a donation) to Hunt Funds from the person involved, may keep you off the front page – depends how 'small' the donation is!). It is hoped a display of 'Tumbles' (from both professional and amateur photographers) can be arranged for display at the Tumblers' Club end of Season Party.
- There will be a trophy and prizes for the winners (or should that be losers?) To be presented at a Tumblers' Party/ function at the end of the Season (March)
- Tumblers' Club is open to all who hunt regularly - all ages, all shapes and sizes! All you need is a sense of humour!
- The Tumblers will raise funds for the Hunt by –
 - Contributions of £5 for the 1st tumble then an increase of £1 will be added for each subsequent tumble – £5+£1; £6+£1 and so on, or £10 first tumble then all others FOC.
 - Proceeds from the end of Season Tumblers' Party (which is already in the planning stages and will be an excellent evening)

An alternative is available which is intended for consideration by the super confident – the payment of a one off 'anti bump' premium of £25 to be paid at the start of the Autumn Season This enables you to be automatically entered into the end of Season 'Super Seat' Draw' – however, if you do tumble the 'anti bump' payment immediately becomes invalid and you have to join the Tumblers' Club and pay your contributions.

- Please note – Membership of the Tumblers' Club will be double the charge for Red coats and / or buttons. Staff will be invited to join the Tumblers, as will The Huntsman.
- 'Big Brother' is not spying on you to see if you tumble – but, as everyone knows, the Field, the Foot Followers, Photographers etc: don't really miss much - so if you do tumble – you really can't pretend it didn't happen – just bite the bullet and give Jenny T.W. the details and your contribution. If you do quietly look over your shoulder and re-mount, remember the mud on your jacket always gives you away!!
- It's hoped that if you do tumble, it's only your ego that's dented and you'll feel able to join in the fun and become a fully qualified member of the 'Elite' Tumblers' Club.
- Intentional bail-outs do not qualify.

Do you know anything about the Hunt's history @ Cridling Stubbs?

Can anyone help me or point me in the right direction for my research into the history of Cridling Stubbs?
